There comes a time in our life when we have to learn how to swim, or we sink into the deep abyss. This year is one of those times for me. I have been writing about body image and eating disorders for the past couple of months because it is profoundly troubling and personal. Many of you have let me know that I am not alone. I wanted to share that the struggle with spirituality, food, faith, and body image is real. It is a constant pull from what we know to be true to what is true.



***Faith is the evidence of things unseen; it is hoped for in this world of darkness.***

A week before Christmas, I was scheduled to have bariatric surgery (weight loss). This procedure was unfortunately canceled due to hospitals shutting down from elective surgeries. I eagerly await a date for this procedure because I am at a place in my life where I have to learn how to 'spiritually' swim. I have to re-learn faith all over again—faith in my family, friends, and God to carry me through this to the other side. You may even say that I need to learn to have faith in myself.

Jesus' disciples had walked with Jesus for the better part of three years, but they didn't know how to have faith. Peter was so confident that when Jesus called to him from the water, he got out of the boat and walked on water. That was, of course, until he noticed the wind and the waves and panicked. He sank like a rock. Jesus didn't leave him. He picked him up and helped him into the boat. Jesus says to Peter, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" Having faith is more than getting out of the boat. It is more than just staying away from fast food and controlling our needs, wants, and desires.

***Having faith requires closing our eyes and free-falling into the hands of God.***



I am at the edge of the cliff; I am ready to dive off that cliff and know that God is going to catch me or give me wings to fly on the way down. However, I have to trust God more than I trust myself because I will always fail when left to my own devices, whereas God never fails.

For the better part of my life, I have been stepping out of the boat and sinking like a rock. I have tried every fad diet and lifestyle change that I can think of out there. It's time to take the plunge and trust God. It's time my faith life kept my eyes forward on Jesus, the perfecter of faith.

Perhaps 2022 is the right time to do this surgery. I know it will be a challenging new start, but I know I will come out stronger than I was before with God's blessing. Please be gentle with me and pray for me at this time. I will continue to keep you posted as I dive off of this cliff and into the hands of God. God knows I can't do this alone. It is God that will have to catch me on the way down. Now I just have to remember to take that deep breath...breathe, just breathe.


### Do you want to sing or play an instrument?

## Winter Fruit Pie

### INGREDIENTS

- ◆ 1 cup raisins
- ◆ 6 cups of sliced apples and pears sliced about 1/2 inch thick
- ◆ 1 cup of cranberries
- ◆ 3/4 cup brown sugar
- ◆ 1/2 tablespoon cinnamon
- ◆ 1/3 teaspoon vanilla
- ◆ Pinch of nutmeg, pinch of cloves
- ◆ 1 tablespoon butter
- ◆ 2 1/2 tablespoons of corn-starch
- ◆ Pie crust for a 9 inch pie top and bottom

### DIRECTIONS

1. Prepare your pie crust and set aside.
2. Preheat your oven to 425 degrees.
3. Peel and slice the pears and apples. When using pears it is best to have ones that are firm, they will retain their shape in the pie and not turn to mush.
4. In the large bowl, combine the raisins, cranberries and sliced fruit, sprinkle the vanilla over and stir.
5. Mix together the dry ingredients.
6. Toss the dry ingredients with the fruit, coating the fruit mixture completely. Scoop into the prepared bottom pie crust, mounding the fruit in the middle slightly.
7. Take the tablespoon of butter and dot over the top of the fruit.
8. Top pie with the remaining crust, crimp the edges to seal and cut pie vents on the top.
9. Bake at 425 degrees for 10 minutes on the bottom rack of your oven, making sure to cover the edges of your pie with a cover or tinfoil. (This pie has to bake a long time and the edges will get too brown).
10. Turn the oven down to 350 degrees and bake the pie for another 50-60 minutes, removing the tinfoil for the last 20 minutes or so, and bake until the top is nicely browned and the filling is bubbling. Remove from oven and cool on rack.
