When I was in kindergarten, we tricked one of my classmates into putting a penny into an electric outlet. You guessed it, he got shocked and all the lights in the classroom went out. I have repented of this many times and, still, I wish I could apologize to John.

When a process is short-circuited, it means that it came off the rails somewhere between the beginning and the end. When we short-circuit the work of God by not paying attention to the plan laid out in the scriptures, we enter into dark territory. Like a train going through a tunnel, it's pitch black with only the light on the front of the engine to guide its journey.

Sometimes I feel like I am not a passenger on the train so much as the fool looking into the tunnel standing on the tracks pointing and saying, "Train!" Not an intelligent thing to do. We don't have to "see" the light to know the train is coming. We can listen and hear the click of the wheels on the track and hear the blast of the whistle.

These past weeks have been a time of preparation for the unknown. March 25th is right around the corner, and I will admit that I am anxious about my bariatric surgery. In practice, I have already lost 45lbs since April of 2021. Yet, I know there is a long way to go. My end goal is to make weight to go skydiving this summer over the Grand Tetons National Park. And you thought I was crazy a while ago. I promise if I get up the courage to skydive, I will show the footage in church on a Sunday morning. Mary shared that she will be on the ground with our life insurance agent on speed dial. I want to kiss the face of God, not smack the ground.

My anxiety about this surgery has been through the roof. What if this? What if that? What will I look like? Am I going to have any clothes that fit? All of this has the potential to short-circuit my plan for surgery. What I need to have as opposed to fear-filled anxiety is the optimal anxiety to propel me forward into a life-changing reality that will bless my family and me.

God doesn't want us to live in anxiety or fear. God wants us to trust in the plans set forth and when the time comes to "pull the shoot" and make a safe accident-free landing. I want to challenge you to make a life plan related to God and follow it. Put it into practice each day, hour, and week. Discipleship is not about perfection. It's about following the plan of God in whichever direction it leads.

The first step is simply to know that God loves you so much that he gave his only Son to die for you that you might be saved and live an entire life of freedom and grace. Practice that step, over and over, and I promise your life will begin to fall into place. The beginning of wisdom starts when we realize that only we have the power to short-circuit our relationship with God. Take heart though God is on the move, and he will continually call you back to his bosom. You are a beloved child of the KING of KINGS! Never forget who you came from and to whom you belong.

Nine days to go, two doctors' appointments, and a covid test. After that, I will depart for the hospital at 4:45 am, and by noon, I will have a new lease on life for the next 50 years.

Thank you for all of your kind words, thoughts, and prayers. It is good to know that my church family has my back.


Scripture Writing plans are something you can do every day and it will help you in your journey with God. Get your bi-

INGREDIENTS

- ◆ 6 oz Nestle's Butterscotch morsels
- ◆ 1/4 cup butter
- ◆ 1 cup light brown sugar
- ◆ 2 eggs
- ◆ 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- ◆ 1 cup flour
- ◆ 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ◆ 3/4 teaspoon salt
- ◆ 1/2 cup chopped walnuts



I hope you enjoy the Butterscotch brownies, they are such a great treat and so easy to make, and if you cut them in small pieces, you can have more than one!!"

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F and grease 13" x 9" baking pan.
2. In a medium bowl, melt butterscotch morsels and butter in microwave.
3. Stir in brown sugar and cool for 5 minutes.
4. Blend in 2 eggs and vanilla.
5. Stir in flour, baking powder and salt, stir in walnuts.
6. Pour into pan and bake for 25 minutes, let cool.
7. Cut into squares and dust with powdered sugar (optional).
