I will be keeping you in prayer as we journey together. God bless you and your family this day and always!





It was time to plant a garden. My wife decided to dedicate a portion of her little garden to the children. They would pick out what they wanted to plant, care for it, and then reap the benefits of God's miracle of growing plants and vegetables.

When Benjamin was asked what he would like to plant in his vegetable garden, he quickly replied, "Mashed potatoes!" If it worked, I hoped he would generously share the harvest with his dad.

The boring, practical, no-fun adult in us would be tempted to quickly respond, "No, Benjamin, you can't do that. Pick something else."

Hey! Lighten up before squelching a fun and creative idea! Mashed potatoes? Why not! So what if the neighbors see us! Let's even make a little popsicle-stick marker that reads, "Mashed Potatoes." Let's praise the Lord with a fun garden complete with mashed potatoes and maybe some Toll House chocolate chip cookie plants while we're at it! Praise the Lord with chocolate! And all of God's chocoholics said, "Amen!"

Who knows how the Lord might surprise us as we get on our knees at the end of the summer to see what miracles popped out of the ground! We adults need to get in sync with our children's faith and sense of joy!

I love considering how joyful God must have been when he did some planting of his own. Who would have thought that something great could come out of that little town of Bethlehem (Luke 2:1–20)? Nathanael learned that something good could come out of Nazareth (John 1:43–51). Have you ever wondered how the people responded when Jesus decided to plant a Saul in his garden to bear fruit (Acts 9:1–19)? Ever wonder why he decided to plant you where you are planted? Don't underestimate God or his ability to work miracles. And don't underestimate your ability to praise him as he deserves to be praised. Praise him for growing your faith in what you thought was an unproductive garden.

I love reflecting on the Lord's great sense of humor in planting me in the middle of this wonderful family and saying to me, "Grow into a father, Tim! I'll water you with my grace, feed you with your Savior's forgiveness, and nurture you with a life-giving Word. I'll provide a great cloud of witnesses to surround you and be an example for you (Hebrews 12:1). And I will let my Son shine brightly upon you as you grow. God has even placed a piece of wood, in the shape of a cross, over the spot where he planted me. It reads, "Timothy, My Redeemed Child." And here I grow . . . blooming, by his grace alone, where he has planted me. Who would have guessed?

What's next? In response to God's creativity and power, the Bible tells us that his people did some radical things! They praised their Lord in the sanctuary with trumpets and harps, with tambourines and dancing, with the clash of cymbals, with resounding cymbals (Psalm 150)! Some people are uncomfortable. Imagine what they would do if you started a church cymbal choir! They might grow into the kind of radical people God had in mind when he created them. They might just praise the Lord in a way that they have never experienced before.

MEMORIAL COMMITTEE CAMPERSHIPS:

The Faith Journey Memorial Committee has money in the Memorial Fund designated for camperships. SUMMERTIME GRILLING!

IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR...BBQ TIME!

With the weather getting warmer here in Syracuse and surrounding areas, and being outside more, I can smell the grills firing up. I love using my grill throughout the summer to save time on cooking and from getting my kitchen so hot. Be sure to try one of these delicious **grilling recipes** the next time you want something off the grill!

Grilled Teriyaki Chicken

- 4 to 6 Boneless chicken breasts, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 3/4 cup Teriyaki Sauce, divided
- 5 scallions, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 tsp. sesame seeds

Directions:

- 1. Take a Ziploc bag and put chicken & 1/2 cup Teriyaki sauce. Refrigerate for 4 hours or overnight.
- 2. Thread chicken & scallions onto skewers. You can also add pineapple chunks (canned, not fresh) onto skewers as well, or fresh veggies. Brush with remaining teriyaki sauce.
- 3. Grill until done and tender.

⇒ Serve this amazing Skewer with Fried Rice or on a bed of white rice with soy sauce. Enjoy!

Sunday Schools

July we studied The Stories Jesus Told – The Two Houses, The Two Debtors, the Mustard Seed and the Yeast, The Pharisee and the Tax Collector, and the Ten Talents. During August we will be studying The People Jesus Met – The Man in the Synagogue, Mary and Martha, The Woman at the Well and the Many by the Pool.

Sunday School continues throughout the summer – although typical congregations in the United States see a drop in attendance if they do summer Sunday School the refugee congregations typically maintain their attendance as they do not do as much vacationing. So we are very busy.

All of the refugee congregations took a break from regular Sunday worship and Sunday School when we celebrated Methodists Around the World At Andy's Camp! What a great day and fun way for everyone to spend time together. The kids love the games and outdoor toys and the chance to explore the outdoors more than they typically can at home.

Nepali Sunday School

Connie Clark works with the children during the earliest service at Mattydale for the Nepali congregation. There are approximately 15 children in that group. Some of the Nepali women and older children come down to help. This group has a lot of younger children, so they need extra help getting their work done.

Karenni Sunday School

The Karenni class meets at about 11:15 and can have up to 16 children in the group, although last Sunday we had 21. Children from age 2 through elementary school come to class. The class hears the lesson works on the booklets and enjoys the craft. The work booklets continue to be a fun way the children enjoy challenging each other.

New World Ministry Sunday School

The Sudanese group has between 5 and 10 children. They enjoy the workbooks and the younger ones also spend time working on the craft.

Clay Sunday School

The Clay Sunday School has had as many as three participants two Sundays in July. In addition, there are usually younger ones for the nursery. We enjoy spending time working on the worksheets together and doing the craft. All school age children participate and preschoolers who are interested sometimes listen to the story or color a worksheet. During July we made a humility rock, a mustard seed cross necklace and some other fun crafts.


