Dear Church Family,

Grace and peace to you from God the Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

This has been a beautiful September! God has blessed us with fresh vision for Faith Journey United Methodist Church. It is important to know that your Ministries Council is working hard to carry out the mission of the church which is to "Seek, Serve, and Share God with others." We look forward to growing from our time of transition and living into this calling as a people of God.

For today's newsletter article I wanted to share my heart with you. In my private study time I turned to the prophet Malachi for some guidance on tithes and offerings. I chose this passage as a reminder of the faithfulness of God. This is the only area where the Lord tells us that we are allowed to test him. Friends you cannot out give God and generosity is good for the heart. I want to thank you for all your faithfulness over the years to the Faith Journey United Methodist Church. Without your giving of financial resources, the church would not exist.

A couple of weeks ago during Sunday Morning worship the church leadership reported to the congregation on the state of the church. This was a concerning report because it highlighted the financial struggles that the Faith Journey Church is having at this time. Our income is less than our expenses and that means that every month decisions have to be made as to what to pay and what not to pay. Lately this has been coming too close for comfort. Weeks have come and gone where the question of paying staff or utilities comes first. Staff has and always will come first as we are obligated for their services rendered.

One of the most vital areas that has not been paid are the *pastor's pension, health insurance, disability, and shared ministry costs.* This is a problem and it cannot go on as the status quo. The next few months will be critical as the Ministry Council makes decisions as how to meet these needs. I urge you to be praying and asking God how you can be part of the solution.

I realize that this might come as a shock, believe me it was for me. I have only been serving as your pastor since July and trying to navigate these financial issues has been a challenge. However, I am confident that the best days of this church are out ahead of us. God has not brought us this far to leave us. We are facing an extraordinary financial situation that can easily make or break this ministry. I need your faith and your support in this time to right this financial ship and to move forward with the ministry plans that are already under way. We need to lean on God and trust He will provide for our needs.

I am hopeful that by working together we can solve these financial issues and be poised for greatness. There has never been a more critical moment in life of the church which needs your active involvement to provide for a solution. Please consider your response prayerfully. Druss Kususi

A program that tutors our New World Ministries children

Druss Kususi started September 22nd. We had 12 children attending. Because it was a special day at Path of Life we shortened the time for tutoring a little. We asked the children to come up with goals for the coming school year. In addition, we asked them to tell us what they are working on right now in every subject and what they think they need to work on. Of course, we had snack and lunch. We weren't able to do any cooking due to time constraints and not being sure whether we would have access to the kitchen or not.

With 12 children in the group we really need some more tutors. If you have any interest in working with children to improve their academic skills please consider joining us. You don't need to be there every week if you are unable. We follow the school schedule and cancel for the weeks that they are out of school. You can be assigned to work with one or a small group of kids. A teaching background isn't required and is unnecessary to work with the younger children. A background check is required and a sincere desire to help children is needed.

If you aren't able or interested in working with children we can always use donations. We provide a simple morning snack and lunch during the program. Most of the time the children don't wake up in time for breakfast at home and come in hungry. They also really appreciate having a meal before they leave. Donations of juice boxes – the larger size and only 100% juice please, Pop Tarts – preferably Cinnamon and sugar, S'Mores, Strawberry with frosting; paper plates, cups, plastic knives, forks and spoons are helpful. We also need to purchase workbooks for the kids so donations for food or supplies are greatly appreciated and can be in the form of gift cards to Wegmans, Price Chopper, Walmart, Five Below, Dollar Tree or Ollie's or cash or check. Make sure your donations are clearly labeled for Druss Kususi so that they get to the correct place.



Path of life News:

Many of you have met at least some of the Sudanese, Karennis, and Nepalis who make up the congregations at Path of Life Ministries in Mattydale. They have attended worship here at Clay and used space in the former Andrews Memorial. They have been at Andy's Camp and have come to some special events here. Some of you have been to Mattydale to help with tutoring or Sunday School. The first Sudanese were actually members of Andrews Memorial.

There have been some new, exciting developments that I would like to make you aware of. The Karenni church now owns the Mattydale building. On Saturday, September 22 all of the congregations using the space held a worship service there together – symbolizing working together as refugee congregations in Mattydale. They then held a cleaning day and shared a meal. Everyone, from the oldest members to some of the youngest children participated. It was an exciting day!

The Rev. Sean Chanthasone continues to work with the Karenni and Nepalis in order to help them build their congregations and learn what it means to be United Methodist. He spent time explaining to me the hopes they have for building renovation and new programming. He has obtained some money from one of the national church boards to help fund some of the things they are hoping to do.

We are very excited about the possibilities that exist now that they have access to the building as needed which will allow them to have space for new programs and ministries.

Recipe by: Linda Smith - Jell-O Pudding Salad

INGREDIENTS

1 8oz. Cool whip

- 1 lg. pkg. vanilla Cook-to-serve pudding.
- 1 pkg. Jell-O, choose your flavor

DIRECTIONS

- Cook pudding according to directions but using water instead of milk. Bring to boil over med. heat. Take off burner and add dry Jell-O to cooked pudding.
- Dissolve Jell-O, then refrigerate overnight. Beat the set mixture till smooth. Add cool whip, mix till well blended. Then fold in fresh fruit (strawberries, raspberries, blackberries, peaches, etc. are good) the more fruit, the better it is.

FALL COOKING!

It's that time of year y'all!

Don't you just love it when the leaves start to fall, it's getting cooler, windows are open in the house and you smell the apple pie in the oven. I love going to the apple orchard and pick the apples straight from the tree, what a gift from God. So, take some time, sit on the front porch, drink a cup of coffee and let the whisper of God's voice speak to you...it's in the falling leaves and wind.

Apple-Cinnamon Monkey Bread

- PAM® Grilling Spray
- 2 cans Pillsbury Grands Flaky cinnamon rolls
- 1 medium tart apple, peeled & chopped
- 1/2 sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup butter, melted



Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 350. Grease or spray a fluted tube cake pan.
- 2. Separate each can of dough into 5 rolls, cut into quarters.
- 3. Place apple in a small bowl. In another bowl, mix sugar and cinnamon. add 1/4 cup sugar mixture to apple; toss to coat. Sprinkle half of apple pieces in pan. Roll half of dough pieces in sugar mix; place on apples in pan.
- 4. Sprinkle with remaining apple pieces. Roll remaining dough in sugar mixture; place on apples. Pour melted butter on top.
- 5. Bake for 40-50 min. or until golden brown across top. Cool 10 min.; run knife around edge of pan to loosen. Place a serving plate over pan and turn over; remove pan. Cool for another 10 min.
- 6. Drizzle reserved icing over top of bread, allowing to drizzle on side. Pull apart to serve!

In September we started a new curriculum called Deep Blue Connects At Home With God. The first unit was about Jesus' Family. It seemed a little strange to the children to be talking about Jesus birth at the beginning of the school year but when all the sessions for the unit are put together it's a great starting place to learn about who Jesus might have considered his family. Nepali Sunday School

Connie Clark works with the children during the earliest service at Mattydale for the Nepali congregation. There are approximately 15 children in that group. Some of the Nepali women and older children come down to help. This group has a lot of younger children, so they need extra help getting their work done.

Karenni Sunday School

The Karenni class is next. Children from age 2 through elementary school come to class. The class hears the lesson works on the booklets and enjoys the craft. The children often have to split their time between watching their younger siblings and doing class work. They have taken a couple of Sundays off as they have picnics or visit Sean Chanthasone and the Binghamton church.

New World Ministry Sunday School

The Sudanese group has between 5 and 10 children. They enjoy the workbooks and the younger ones also spend time working on the craft.

Clay Sunday School

The Clay Sunday School continues to have a number of children each week. In addition, there are usually younger ones for the nursery. We enjoy spending time working on the worksheets together and doing the craft. All school age children participate and preschoolers who are interested sometimes listen to the story or color a worksheet. Update on the C&B building


