DRUSS KUSUSI -


A program that tutors our New World Ministries children

Druss Kususi has been very active. We have had 7-12 children each week. Every week we work on writing and reading comprehension as well as Math and whatever homework they may bring. We have also been having fun cooking with Debbie Riggall now that we have been able to use the kitchen. Red Velvet cookies were our first adventure and we made chicken curry soup this week. Some of the kids found the cookies to be too sweet as they were frosted. The soup was really good and we discussed ways we could adapt the recipe depending on what we had in the house.

It would be helpful to have some more tutors. If you have any interest in working with children to improve their academic skills please consider joining us. You don't need to be there every week if you are unable. We follow the school schedule and cancel for the weeks that they are out of school. You can be assigned to work with one or a small group of kids. A teaching background isn't required and is unnecessary to work with the younger children. A background check is required and a sincere desire to help children is needed.

If you aren't able or interested in working with children we can always use donations. We provide a simple morning snack and lunch during the program. Most of the time the children don't wake up in time for breakfast at home and come in hungry. They also really appreciate having a meal before they leave. Donations of juice boxes – the larger size and only 100% juice please, Pop Tarts – preferably Cinnamon and sugar, S'Mores, Strawberry with frosting; paper plates, cups, plastic knives, forks and spoons are helpful. Make sure your donations are clearly labeled for Druss Kususi so that they get to the correct place.

INGREDIENTS

SALAD:

2 med. tomatoes, cut bite size 1 small cucumber, slice thin 1 small onion, thinly slice 1/2 cup pitted kalamata olives

4 oz. mozzarella cheese, cubed 1/2 inch.

VINAIGRETTE:

1/4 cup veg. or olive oil 2 tbsp. white wine vinegar 1 to 2 tbsp. chopped fresh dill weed.

1/4 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. sugar

1/4 tsp. pepper

STEP 1:


Place all salad ingredients except cheese cubes in serving bowl; toss lightly.

STEP 2:

Whisk together all vinaigrette ingredients in bowl. Pour over salad; toss well. Refrigerate at least 4 hours to blend flavors. Stir in cheese just before serving.



FALL COOKING!

It's that time of year y'all!

Are you ready for Thanksgiving? I certainly am, it's my favorite time of year, all of the leaves are falling, I bake all kinds of goodies, turkey is being prepared and all of the side dishes. We have a tradition in the house, on Thanksgiving evening, my husband bakes cookies and we all decorate our tree and drink hot chocolate. It's so much fun. What's your tradition?

Sage rubbed Roasted Turkey

- 1 whole turkey, (12 to 14 pounds), fresh or frozen, thawed
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons Sage
- 1 tablespoon Lawry's® Seasoned Salt
- 2 teaspoons paprika
- 1 1/2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper



Directions:

- 1. Place oven rack in lowest position. Preheat oven to 325°F. Place roasting rack in shallow roasting pan. Mix seasonings in small bowl.
- 2. Place turkey, breast-side up, in prepared pan. Sprinkle 1 table-spoon of the seasoning mixture inside turkey. Brush turkey breast with oil. Spread remaining seasoning mixture over entire surface and under skin of turkey. Add 1/2 cup water to pan. Cover turkey loosely with heavy duty foil.
- 3. Roast 1 hour. Remove foil. Roast 2 to 2 1/2 hours longer or until internal temperature reaches 165°F (175°F in thigh), basting occasionally with pan juices. Remove turkey from oven. Let stand 20 minutes. Transfer to platter or carving board and slice. Reserve pan juices to make gravy or to serve with turkey.

Update on the C&B building


