





Some children really love working on the crafts and even the young-



est who aren't able to do much of it for themselves want one to take home. Some groups have the chance to sing some favorite children's church songs. We also work with the refugee groups to make sure they learn the Lord's Prayer in English. There have been more children attending the Clay Sunday School more regularly. Last Sunday we had 8 children in Sunday School and the nursery. The Karenni group is a has two very young preschoolers who join us and color and take part in craft activities.

DRUSS KUSUSI - A program that tutors our New World Ministries children

We have had two weeks of Druss Kususi during March due to children not showing up. There was lower attendance due to lack of rides, weather and people not wanting to get going on Saturday mornings. However, we continued to work on skills and cooking for the kids that wanted to.

We start the morning with snack. We then it look at what happened during the week that was good. Then it's time for prayer.

Cooking is fun for the kids. This month we made chicken baked in the oven and buffalo chicken macaroni and cheese. This was an especially fun activity as each child had their own pan to put ingredients in, mix and heat. The macaroni and cheese was really good.

Academic skills are also important and the primary reason we are there. Math and English worksheets that have themes which are appropriate to the season, holiday or something we are focused on helps to make working on skills more fun. We continue to work on primarily math skills but whatever else the children need.

We end with lunch at which time we are able to share the food that was prepared if it is ready. Otherwise the kids get to take it home and share it with their families.

Carrot Cake Trifle

- 1 box of Carrot Cake Mix
- 1 Carrot
- 8oz. Softened Cream Cheese
- 1.5 sticks of softened butter
- 3.5 cups of powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 16oz. Cool Whip
- Chopped Walnuts or pecans



So much progress has been done at the building!

In the retail space: the walls are primed in all rooms, ceiling insulation is about ½ complete and the drop ceiling frame is being installed in the former 'garage' space. We have contracted with a plumber and are in the process of obtaining a permit for the plumbing and making necessary alterations to meet ADA standards in the bathroom - after this is completed we will be ready for the plumbing to be inspected.

In the house (new worship / meeting area): the outside walls have new plywood and house wrap on the back wall, upper side wall (looking over retail space) and ½ the front of the house. The old chimney blocks have been removed and beams in the upstairs have been prepared so that the space can be 'opened up'. Windows will soon be framed and plans to run the electricity are in the works. A business plan is being created by the Cradle & Beyond committee - this will create the foundation on how the retail space will operate. Please keep the dedicated work crew and the Cradle and Beyond committee members in your prayers as they continue to dedicate their time and energy in working to create this into an amazing FJUMC space.

WHAT IS HOLY WEEK?

Holy Week now and in Jesus Time:

TODAY: Holy Week is the week before Easter.

The Sunday before Easter is Palm Sunday, when the crowds welcomed Jesus waving branches and shouting "Hosanna".

The Thursday in that week before Easter is "Maunday Thursday", the day Jesus had the Last Supper with the Apostles and from which we get the base for communication.

The Friday before Easter is Good Friday, It is the day Jesus was Crucified. So what can be "GOOD" about it? There are 2 ideas about it. 1. Some churches say that this terrible day had to happen so Jesus could be resurrected and that 's the good part. 2. Second idea about "GOOD" is that in ancient times, "Good" meant holy, pious, or devout. The Bible is sometimes called the "Good" Book. The New Testament is sometimes called "Good" News. Substituting the word "Holy" for "Good".

Matthew 21:1-11 - Jesus enters Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) Matthew 21:12-17 - Jesus Cleanses the temple Matthew 26:26-30 - Jesus and the disciples eat together (Last Supper) Matthew 26:36-46 - Jesus prays in Gethsemane Matthew 26:46-49 - Judas kisses Jesus Matthew 26:50-56 - Jesus is arrested Matthew 26:69-75 - Peter denies knowing Jesus Matthew 27:11-14 - Jesus questioned by Pilate Matthew 27:29 - Jesus gets a crown of thorns Matthew 27:32-44 - Jesus is put on the cross Matthew 27:45 - There is darkness at noon Matthew 27:57-61 - Jesus is wrapped in linen cloth and put in tomb Matthew 28:1-11 - Easter




What is April Fools Day?

It is commonly believed that in medieval France, New Years was celebrated on April 1st. Then in 1562, Pope Gregory introduced a new calendar for the Christian world, changing New Years to January 1st. With no modern communications, news traveled slowly and new ideas were often questioned. Many people did no hear of the change, others chose to ignore it, while some merely forgot. These people were called fools. Invitations to non-existent "New Year" parties were sent and other practical jokes were played. This jesting evolved over time into a tradition of playing pranks on April 1st.
