I have been thinking about this song by Bob Dylan for the past couple of weeks. I realize that Dylan was talking about social change and the turbulent 1960s but I think that the overarching theme of this song is applicable to the church today. "For the times they are a-changing..."

On November 4, 2015, the Faith Journey United Methodist Church was born out to two great churches: Andrews Memorial United Methodist Church & Trinity United Methodist Church. Both churches have a rich history in mission and ministry and for many years dreamed big dreams for the future. Unfortunately, time had taken its toll on membership and finances and the need to merge and consolidate became a necessity. Mergers are never a fun process. They are long, grueling, and sometimes discouraging processes. Sometimes we do mergers correctly and other times we miss steps along the way.

Trinity United Methodist Church was born out of a merger in the 1960s. It the end result of the merger of the Euclid church and the Morgan Road church. I don't know what all the issues were with that merger but my hope is that it was born out of mission and ministry as opposed to necessity.

Churches, however, have a life cycle. They are born, they grow, and unless they adapt and change to the culture around them they will cease to exist. As United Methodists, we are terrible at adapting. We like patterns and structures. We need to be constantly listening to the culture around us and grow and adapt the message: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." We need to tell the story in new and fresh ways that open eyes. Our display screens in the sanctuary help us do that by bringing scripture to life and allowing the use of popular movie clips to enhance the sermon. We are just beginning to discover the possibilities of using the gospel message in a new and relevant way.

In 1968, the United Methodist Church was born out of a merger. That merger would be the defining moment for Methodism in the world. It all started in 1954, with merger talks between the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church. Both denominations had their roots in Wesleyan theology and the gifts that each church brought to the table were powerful; membership, money, influence, power, colleges, and seminaries. It made sense to build a denomination that would radically impact and change the world. In 1968, the merger was complete. A powerhouse denomination was born. Methodism was now a part of the mainline protestant churches. However, with the merger came a need to cleanse the church of its hurtful and racist past. The central conferences which segregated clergy black and white were abolished and geographic conferences and jurisdictions were established. But there were

other issues that weren't resolved. Theological issues are still being debated.

As I write this article the Special Session of General Conference of the United Methodist Church is meeting in St. Louis, Missouri. The special session of the General Conference has been called to discuss and act on the Bishop's commission on a "Way Forward." There are three plans and numerous petitions that will be voted on in hopes of restructuring the church in order to settle the issue of human sexuality and the place of LGBTQ individuals within the church. I have no idea what is going to happen with the United Methodist Church. I am not a prognosticator.

What I do know and am confident of is this: God has not brought us this far to leave us or forsake us. I believe in the move of the Holy Spirit and the power of God to build bridges and work towards unity as opposed to division and strife. I am confident that the mission and ministry will continue no matter how we resolve our differences of belief. Make no mistake this will not be the final word on this subject.

On March 3rd we will welcome home the 12:30 worship service and the members that have been so faithful to be present at Pitcher Hill Community Church for the past two years. They have been present with their financial gifts, time, and talents. We will conclude our services at the Pitcher Hill Community Church on February 24th and begin worshiping at the Morgan Road campus. These are your brothers and sisters in Christ. It is your privilege to get to know them and welcome them into the life of faith. We will continue to have three services 9:30, 11:00, and 12:30. Maryna Mazhukhova will continue her ministry of music leading the 12:30 service.

Be prepared for the faith journey of a lifetime. In the coming months, you will see the continued vision for Faith Journey United Methodist Church develop in new ways. "For the times they are a-changin'..." We will adapt and overcome our challenges together in grace and humility. There is power in together, never underestimate what two or three can do when gathered in Christ's name. May God have mercy on our United Methodist Church and on the faithful members who carry on its mission and ministry.







Recipe by: Mechele Wright - Pizza Pot Pie

INGREDIENTS

1/2 lb. Italian Sausage

1/2 Cup Chopped green peppers & onions

- 1 cup mozzarella cheese
- 1/2lb. Refrigerated pizza dough
- 1 tbsp. olive oil
- ed



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Heat oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Spray 6 ramekins with spray, coat evenly.
- 3. Cook sausage in skillet, add vegetables, cook on medium heat until sausage is browned. Remove from skillet from heat; stir in pizza sauce. Spoon into ramekins, top with mozzarella cheese.
- 1 tbsp. parmesan cheese, grat- 4. Cut pizza dough into 6 pieces; roll each into 41/2" round on lightly floured surface. Press 1 round over each ramekin, press lightly. Brush with oil and sprinkle with parmesan.
 - 5. Cut small slit on top of each crust to vent. Place on foil -covered baking sheet and bake 25-30 min.

During February the theme was Family Wisdom. Sessions include – Families Remember God, Family Traditions, A Family's Faith, and Family Proverbs. Lent starts in March so the focus will primarily be on Jesus parables, Holy Week and the Passion. Lessons include The Stories of the Lost, The Forgiving Father, The Two Debtors, The Last Supper and In the Garden.

Classes continue for all groups – the children at Clay, the Karennis, the Sudanese and the Nepalis. We all use the same United Methodist curriculum – especially important for new refugee congregations so that the people have a better understanding of what United Methodists believe. Crafts, coloring pages and worksheets help to reinforce the lesson. It's especially fun to watch the children work together or challenge each other to finish the worksheets. Some children really love working on the crafts and even the youngest who aren't able to do much of it for themselves want one to take home. Some groups have the chance to sing some favorite children's church songs. We also work with the refugee groups to make sure they learn the Lord's Prayer in English.

There have been more children attending the Clay Sunday School more regularly. We now often have two or three children in Sunday School – although the younger ones often prefer to play than to do the lessons, they are being exposed to our faith as they play. -Kathy LaDuca

DRUSS KUSUSI - A program that tutors our New World Ministries children

We had two weeks of Druss Kususi during February due to the school break. There was lower attendance due to lack of rides, weather and people not wanting to get going on Saturday mornings. However, we continued to work on skills and cooking for the kids that wanted to.

It's important for us to start the morning with snack so that they aren't hungry and can concentrate on what we are doing. When we are no longer hungry it is important to look at what happened during the week that was good. I insist they come up with one thing that happened during the week that was good — even if it is sleeping in or playing a game. The adults also have to think of something which helps the children to realize that even when we have trouble coming up with an answer there is always something worth being thankful for that happened during the week. Then it's time for prayer.

Cooking is a good thing for the kids. Both boys and girls get a chance to learn cooking skills – which is not really part of their culture. This month we made flavored cupcakes using strawberries for some and mint extract. The kids enjoy homemade sweets. We also made lazy man's lasagna with ravioli. Academic skills are also important and the primary reason we are there. Math and English worksheets that have themes which are appropriate to the season, holiday or something we are focused on helps to make working on skills more fun. One week the kids from one of the families brought a lot of homework they needed help with. This is the best as we are actually working on what they are doing in school. We end with lunch at which time we are able to share the food that was prepared if it is ready. Otherwise the kids get to take it home and share it with their families. Food is an important part of any culture and eating together allows for time to relax and enjoy what we are eating and spending time together. During March, barring any weather issues we are hoping to meet all five weeks.

our church space. Stay tuned for details and be ready to start decluttering and beautifying the Clay Campus beginning on Ash Wednesday (March 6).


Cradle & Beyond 7778 Brewerton Road

So much progress has been done at the building!

In the retail space: the walls are primed in all rooms, ceiling insulation is about ½ complete and the drop ceiling frame is being installed in the former 'garage' space. We have contracted with a plumber and are in the process of obtaining a permit for the plumbing and making necessary alterations to meet ADA standards in the bathroom - after this is completed we will be ready for the plumbing to be inspected.

In the house (new worship / meeting area): the outside walls have new plywood and house wrap on the back wall, upper side wall (looking over retail space) and ½ the front of the house. The old chimney blocks have been removed and beams in the upstairs have been prepared so that the space can be 'opened up'. Windows will soon be framed and plans to run the electricity are in the works. A business plan is being created by the Cradle & Beyond committee - this will create the foundation on how the retail space will operate. Please keep the dedicated work crew and the Cradle and Beyond committee members in your prayers as they continue to dedicate their time and energy in working to create this into an amazing FJUMC space.
