On July 1, 2019, I will celebrate the close of my first year as your pastor and the beginning of my second year. It has been an incredible year of faith as we have moved forward in ministry. God has done some incredible things, and I thought I would highlight them in this article.

- The New Screens in the Sanctuary were a gift from a dear friend of Faith Journey. Along with all the wiring and computer boxes necessary to make the system complete.
- A new WIFI router has been donated and installed in the sanctuary.
- \$1000 was raised for UMCOR flood buckets at the United Methodist Center. This was our Thanksgiving offering.
- \$2000 was raised for the Karenie Path of Life Congregations at the Mattydale Campus. This was our Christmas Eve offering.
- We turned our Ministries Council Meetings into Strategic Planning Sessions to recraft vision and ministry for Faith Journey. We began to meet at the United Methodist Conference Center in Liverpool, NY as we have had to accommodate more people. Currently, we have 15 attending these meetings regularly.
- At our strategic Planning Session, we adopted guiding principles for Faith Journey. We are still working on our vision statement.
- We moved the 12:30 service from Pitcher Hill Community Church to the Morgan Rd. Campus.
- Over 40 blessing bags with supplies for the homeless were collected and distributed this winter.

These are just a few of the things that have been accomplished over the past year. The Lord has been so good to us and blessed us in many ways. These accomplishments do not tell the full story of what has been happening at Faith Journey. I hope and pray that you will come and see that the Lord is good and continues to bless.

It has been my privilege to serve as your pastor. I have learned and grown a lot in my faith journey. I have been watching each of you and seeing the growth that is taking place. I am so very proud of the church you are becoming. Together we can accomplish all that we set out to do in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord, and Savior.

July 4th, 2019, Independence Day!!



"...I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all those who are in authority." I Tim. 2:1-2a (HSCB)

The Continental Congress approved the final wording of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. They'd been working on it for a couple of days after the draft was submitted on July 2nd and finally agreed on all of the edits and changes.

July 4, 1776, became the date that was included on the Declaration of Independence, and the fancy handwritten copy that

was signed in August (the copy now displayed at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.) It's also the date that was printed on the Dunlap Broadsides, the original printed copies of the Declaration that were circulated throughout the new nation. So when people thought of the Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776 was the date they remembered.

In contrast, we celebrate Constitution Day on September 17th of each year, the anniversary of the date the Constitution was signed, not the anniversary of the date it was approved. If we'd followed this same approach for the Declaration of Independence we'd being celebrating Independence Day on August 2nd of each year, the day the Declaration of Independence was signed!

Methodists From Around the World

Faith Journey United Methodist Church "Guiding Principals"

Principle 1: Transparency- "In everything we do as the Faith Journey United Methodist Church, we will do out in the open. Minutes from meetings will be kept and will be accessible. Budgets and financial statements will be available upon request. In house audits of all accounts will be done yearly, and we will comply with all aspects of the 2016 Book of Discipline and our Annual Conference policies. There will be no secrets kept from the congregation except for pastor/parishioner confidentiality and the confidentiality of the Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee."

<u>Principle 2: Excellence-</u>"Excellence will be our native tongue. We will do everything with excellence, or we will not do it at all. From our worship on Sunday morning to the work at the Cradle and Beyond building. Even our dinners and barbecues will be done in such a way as that by doing these things Christ will be glorified."


<u>**Principle 3:**</u> Honor- "We will honor God in everything we do and say. We will show honor to one another and continually listen for wisdom and understanding. We will treat one another as better than ourselves and put the needs of other people first. We will be humble and always remember that the positions that we hold and not for our gratification but the glorification of others in Jesus Christ."

Principle 4: Integrity- "As a people of faith we will conduct ourselves with the highest moral integrity available. We will comply with all Annual Conference policies and the 2016 Book of Discipline to be above reproach. We will be respectful of staff, pastor, pastor's family, and members of the congregation. We will maintain the highest of standards when relating to one another, creating an environment where sexual harassment, racial bigotry, and immoral behavior of any type is not permitted. Our policies will reflect John Wesley's first rule: Do No Harm.

Principal 5: Biblical Authority- "We recognize the scriptures of the old and new testament as the inspired word of God. All 66 books of the Bible are the authority which will guide our church and be the foundation of all that we do as the Church of Jesus Christ.

<u>Principal 6: Inclusion-</u> "As the church of Jesus Christ we are an open and inclusive church of LGBTQIA persons. This position is in stark contrast with our current denominational stance on homosexuality which states: "The United Methodist Church does not condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching..." (See Paragraph 161 of the 2016 Book of Discipline.) We will continue to honor their presence with us and support and sustain them in their Christian walk. "...We affirm God's grace is available to all. We will seek to live together in Christian community, welcoming, forgiving, and loving one another, as Christ has loved and accepted us. We implore families and churches not to reject or condemn lesbian and gay members and friends. We commit ourselves to be in ministry for and with all persons."(Excerpt Par. 161h.) We will not discriminate in employment or ministry positions within the church recognizing that all have gifts for service in the kingdom of God.

Recipe by: Mechele Wright - Bacon Ranch Pasta

INGREDIENTS

12 oz. uncooked tri-color pasta
10 slices bacon, cooked, crumbled
3 tbsp. dry ranch mix
1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1/2 tsp. garlic pepper
1/2 cup milk
1 large tomato, chopped
1 can sliced black olives

1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese

DIRECTIONS 1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil; cook rotini at a boil until tender yet firm to the bite, about 8 minutes; drain.

- 2. Place bacon in a skillet over medium-high heat and cook until evenly brown. Drain and chop.
- In a large bowl, mix mayonnaise, ranch dressing mix, garlic powder, and garlic pepper. Stir in milk until smooth. Place rotini, bacon, tomato, black olives and cheese in bowl and toss to coat with dressing. Cover and chill at least 1 hour in the refrigerator. Toss with additional milk if the salad seems a little dry.






July - Fireworks!!!
