A week ago, as some of you know, I went through gall bladder removal surgery and a hernia repair. I have been convalescing at home and this past Sunday I was back in the pulpit. It was great to be with my church family and friends. The good news is that I am doing well and hopefully will be back to full speed in a couple of weeks. I can't thank you all enough for the thoughts of love and prayers. Thank You!

So much has happened over the past couple of months, I am going to try to summarize.

The memorial plaza (aka parking lot) at the Cradley & Beyond building is ready for asphalt. It has been dug out, and this week; it will be paved. Memorial funds are providing for this project. The remaining \$5000 is in the process of being raised. The building is scheduled to open, November 1, 2019! This is a HUGE accomplishment!

On September 17 a Church Conference was held to affirm the sale of 15.8 acres of vacant property at the North end of our campus 8396 Morgan Rd. for \$550,000. It was approved unanimously. The funds will be used as specified by the church conference to pay off the mortgage on the building, pay off the mortgage at the Cradle and Beyond building, Payback Investment accounts, and repay the Annual Conference our debt. It will be a year before we close on the sale of this property. This has been a diligent effort on behalf of the trustees; I am grateful for all their hard work.

On September 28 we hosted Tom Gilbo as Elvis, and he was amazing. This event was to raise money for the Southern Sudan health project. We raised \$685.00. It costs \$1,500 per year for a home health promoter. Currently, Faith Journey UMC has sponsored one health promoter this year.

I want to thank everyone for making this year a success, my state of the church report will be coming out in a few weeks, and it will chronicle our successes and set the course for 2020. I could not do this without your love and support, and I am thankful to be your pastor. God bless you as you enjoy the autumn in all of its splendor.

Responding to Opioid Overdose

State Targeted Response

Training Description:

Naloxone has been fundamental in the efforts to decrease rates of fatal overdoses. This training teaches first responders, likely opioid overdose witnesses and community members to understand, recognize, respond to and reverse suspected opioid overdoses using naloxone. Participants will learn ways to obtain free or low-cost naloxone for personal use. This training is modeled after the evidence-based SAMHSA Opioid Overdose Prevention Toolkit.

Training objectives include:

- to increase understanding and awareness of fatal overdoses related to opioids and the impact within the community
- · to identify risk factors for an overdose
- · to be able to recognize a suspected overdose
- to be able to identify the five essential steps for first responders as outlined in the SAMHSA Opioid Overdose Prevention Toolkit in the event of an overdose
- · to be able to correctly use naloxone to save lives
- to understand how to access the Naloxone Co-payment Assistance Program (NCAP) to obtain free or low-cost naloxone.

Who Should Attend:

This interactive training is tailored for first responders or other likely witnesses to an opioid overdose.

Why Attend:

- to become part of the solution to solving the opioid issue in the community
- to learn how to save a life during an overdose situation
- to receive education on crucial information related to opioids and the surrounding community

Background:

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) awarded states grants as part of the State Targeted Response (STR) to the opioid crisis. One of New York State's initiatives as part of the grant focuses on addressing opioid overdose related fatalities in counties showing very high rates of overdose deaths and emergency department visits related to opioid use disorder. This initiative involves training thousands of first responders and other likely witnesses in these counties.

Pumpkin Spice White Hot Chocolate

- 2 cups of milk
- 1 cup of white chocolate chips
- 1/2 teaspoons of pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoons of pumpkin spice
- Whipped cream and additional pumpkin spice to sprinkle on top (if desired)

Directions:

- 1. Heat cream and milk in a pan over medium heat, stirring occasionally until hot, but not boiling.
- 2. In a medium sized bowl, pour heated and milk over white chocolate chips, stir until chips are melted.
- 3. Add vanilla extract and pumpkin spice.
- 4. Top with whipped cream and pumpkin spice (if desired)

Classic Chili





INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 cup of chopped onions
- 1 tablespoon of chili powder
- 2 cloves of garlic, finely chopped, or 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons of chopped
- fresh or 1 teaspoon dried
- oregano leaves
- 2 teaspoons of salt
- 2 teaspoons of red pepper sauce
- 1 can of diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 can of red kidney beans

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a 3-quart saucepan, cook beef, onions and garlic over medium heat for 8 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until beef is thoroughly cooked; drain.
- 2. Stir in chili powder, oregano, cumin (for spicy/hot chili), salt, pepper sauce and tomatoes.
- 3. Heat to boiling over high heat. Reduce heat just so mixture bubbles gently
- 4. Cover; cook 1 hour, stirring occasionally
- 5. Stir in kidney beans.
- 6. Heat to boiling over high heat, reduce heat enough just so mixture bubbles gently.
- 7. Cook uncovered about 20 minutes, stirring occasionally, until desired thickness
