Dear Friends,

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ! Happy New Year!

2021 is here, and we are witnesses to Jesus Birth. The Lord of Lord's, the Price of peace, has come into this world to set things right. As witnesses to Jesus' birth, our attitude and focus should be on the things we can see and understand to be God's work in our world.

How is God working in your life? What good are you seeing?

I know how hard it can be to see God in the middle of a storm; the key is not to give up but keep looking for the light in the distance.

Early on in my ministry career, I worked at a small summer camp called Camp Findley. It is on Findley Lake. We still return there every year for vacations and retreats. The lake is about five miles all the way around with an Island in the middle. On the island is a summer home with boat docks. As a camp counselor, we were asked not to go behind the island with the Sunfish Sailboats. The wind shear was just too much for the little craft. One Saturday morning at about 7 am, I got out on the lake with the sailboat. It was perfectly calm. As I went behind the island with the craft, attempting to go around it, a storm came out of nowhere. There was lightning and wind and waves. I was all alone on the lake.

There was nothing I could do. I lowered my sail and removed the mast, and sat there in the middle of the storm. Waves kept crashing over the boat's bow, and I was being pushed into the break wall on the island. I began to cry and pray. Soon after, my Camp Director, Rev. Gary Greenwald, came out with the ski boat and threw me a rope. He pulled me into shore just as the wind and the lightning came to an end. After a stern scolding, we hauled the boat ashore and packed up the mast and its sails. I was humiliated and ashamed for not listening to the rules.

God works in ways that I don't understand. Where did that storm come from on this calm summer's morning? Why then and there? Was God trying to get my attention? Was this God's way of saying that I need to pray? I don't know. I know this; if God wants to make a point, God will and use any means necessary.

I never expected that the first week of 2021 would bring us an assault on the Capitol Building. I was horrified and shocked. I felt helpless. I prayed and watched. As a result of that siege, five people have died. This act of violence is inexcusable. What are we to do when we see such unrest take place? We pray. We pray like we never have before, and we reach out in faith for Jesus, who has come to set things right.

2021 has the potential to be a great year; however, it is up to us to make it great. It is up to us to go through 2021 with a positive attitude and fresh spirit that looks for God's things and not to the disasters of humanity. Being out on that lake that summer's morning taught me two things. Storms will come when we least expect them, and God is never far from us. There will be storms, winds, and waves. They will threaten to sink our sailboats, but take heart God is with us, and God will protect us.

I pray for each of you in 2021 that this year will be the best for you and your family. I pray that God will help you see the light amidst the storm and that your faith will be strengthened. I know that God will bless you and protect you in this time of uncertainty and faith challenges. You are not alone; your rescue boat is coming. Pray. Pray continually and never lose heart, for God is with you and for you.



<u>Apricot Crisp Bars</u>

INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups chopped apricots
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon arrowroot or cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 cups total of all purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups old fashioned oats
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 1 cup melted butter

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Place fruit into mixing bowl. Add the sugar, cinnamon, salt, and almond extract.
- 3. Stir to combine and then let rest on the counter while preparing the crust.
- 4. In a separate mixing bowl, stir together the flour, starch, oats and brown sugar.

5. Add the melted butter and stir to combine. Press half of this mixture into a well-buttered or parchment lined 9x13 pan. Pour the fruit over the bottom crust and then sprinkle the rest of the dry mixture on the top.

6. Bake for 30-35 minutes, until the crust turns golden brown.

7. Serve warm from the oven or let cool completely and slice into servings. Enjoy!

C&B 2.0 donated 30 boxes of clothing to the Red Bird Mission and collected shoeboxes at the church in December, we received an update from the Red Bird Mission and wanted to share it with you.

Greetings,

This year's trip to the Red Bird Mission was very successful. We took 2,025 shoeboxes filled with personal hygiene items, 25 boxes of diapers, over 75 new sheet sets, over 100 backpacks filled with school supplies, handmade scarves, and other miscellaneous items. We drove one 26-foot truck to Kentucky and intend to take another 26-foot truck with clothing and food sometimes in March of 2021.

This year we kept a record of the hours and miles put into this mission. Our drivers drove approximately 4,662 miles picking up donations throughout the Upper New York Conference and driving to Kentucky. The team spent over 400 hours on this mission.

As we look forward to next year's mission, we would like churches to consider donating shoeboxes, backpacks, new blankets and sheet sets, and diapers. The need for clothing is not as critical this time of the year as the warehouse at the mission is usually full of gently used clothes. **New** clothes will still be taken to the Community Outreach Center for distribution.

Once again, I would like to personally thank all of you for your support of this vital mission. It is such a good feeling to know how God works to provide for those in need.
