Pecan Pie Cheesecake Bars

INGREDIENTS

For the Crust

- ◆ 2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- ♦ 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- ◆ 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted

For the Cheesecake

- ◆ 16 oz cream cheese
- ♦ 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- ◆ 2 large eggs
- ♦ 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ◆ 1/8 teaspoon salt

For the Pecan Pie Layer

- ◆ 1 cup light brown sugar, packed
- ♦ 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- ♦ 1/2 cup heavy cream
- ◆ 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- ♦ 1/2 teaspoon salt
- ◆ 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups chopped pecans

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9x9 inch baking dish with parchment paper, spray the pan first with some cooking spray so that the parchment paper will stick to it. Set aside.
- 2. For the Crust: In a food processor, pulse the graham crackers with the sugar until fine crumbs form. Add in melted butter and pulse until well combined. Press the mixture into the bottom of prepared baking dish. You can use your fingers, but it's easier to use the back of a spoon to make sure it's pressed evenly. Set aside.
- 3. For the Cheesecake: Add the cream cheese, sugar, eggs, vanilla extract and salt to the bowl of your mixer. Mix on medium using the whisk attachment until smooth, should take about 5 minutes. Pour this over the graham crust and smooth it out as much as possible with a spatula. Set aside.
- 4. For the Pecan Pie Layer: Add the brown sugar, corn syrup, heavy cream, butter, salt and vanilla extract to a small saucepan and bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Continue cooking for 1 more minute then remove from heat. Stir in the chopped pecans. Pour over the cheesecake layer, and smooth it out with a spatula, if necessary. Transfer the pan to the oven and bake for 40 minutes, the pecan layer should start to get golden. Cool completely then cover with plastic wrap or aluminum foil and refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight. Cut the cheesecake into slices before serving. *These little bars will keep in the fridge for up to 5 days.

Prep Time: 30 mins. / Bake Time: 40 mins. + cooling / Serves: 16
