Dear Church Family,

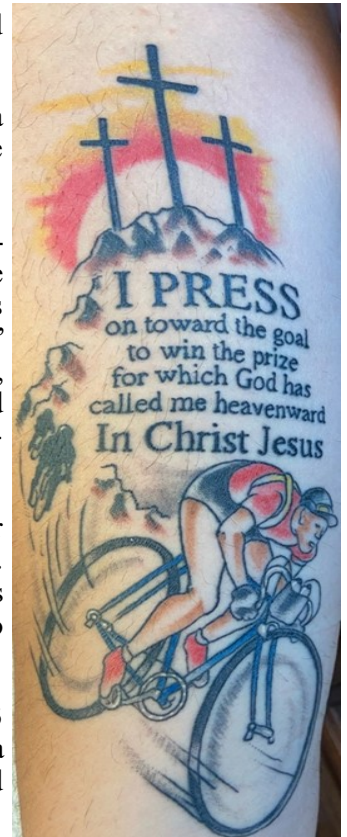
I thank God for each of you daily. Without your love and support, it would not be possible for the ministry to happen. God be with you.

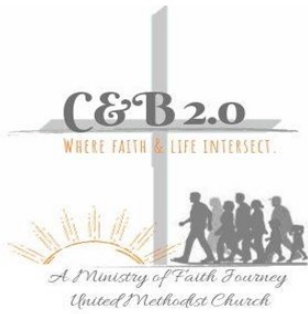

We are coming off a record-selling June and have sold more than \$11,000 worth of merchandise, have tithed \$929 to UMC conference center and have donated merchandise to many non-profit organizations thus far in 2021. In addition, we have seen our customers be in mission by bringing in food for the bread and blessing box and we have customers that have taken bread and shared it with fire stations in the CNY region.

We are blessed over and over by the donations of merchandise that is brought in – I expect this to continue to grow as more and more people hear about us. On the building side, we were able to partner with an Amish Farm and get beams for an incredibly reasonable amount – these will be installed soon. We are also working with Operation Northern Comfort on getting a ramp designed and assembled once the price of lumber comes down. The hope is that we will be open in the Fall 2021.

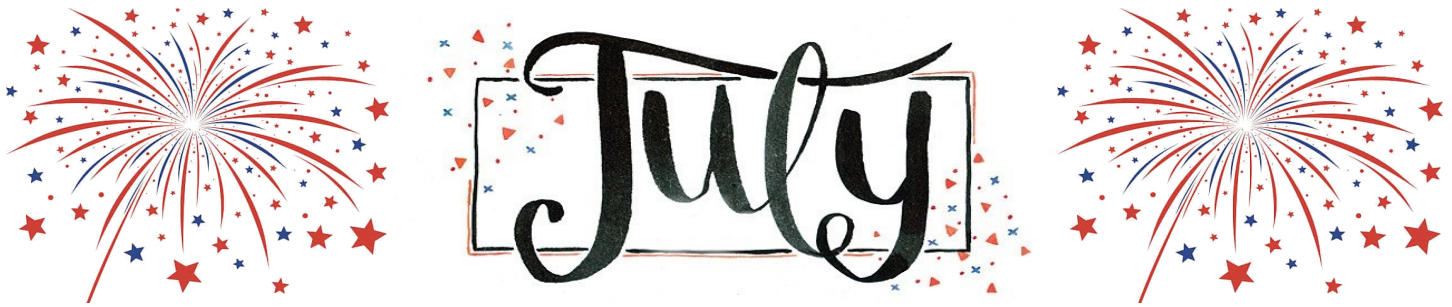


Do you want to sing or play an instrument?

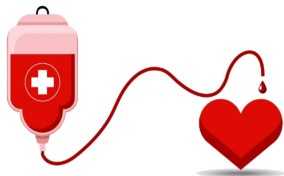

Zucchini Bread Blueberry Crisp

INGREDIENTS

- ◆ 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ◆ 1/2 teaspoon salt
- ◆ 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- ◆ 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- ◆ 1 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- ◆ 2 eggs
- ◆ 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- ◆ 1 cup white sugar
- ◆ 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
- ◆ 1 cup grated zucchini (seeds removed)

Crisp:

- ◆ 2 cups blueberries
- ◆ 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- ◆ 1/2 cup quick-cooking oats
- ◆ 1/4 cup brown sugar, packed
- ◆ 1/4 cup sugar
- ◆ 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ◆ 1/2 pecans, finely chopped
- ◆ 1/2 stick unsalted butter, cubed and softened

DIRECTIONS

1. Begin by spraying two 12.5 oval skillet (or baking dishes) with baking spray. Set aside. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees F.
2. In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda and cinnamon.
3. In a large bowl, beat the eggs, oil, vanilla, and sugar with an electric mixer. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ones and mix until almost combined. Then, stir in the zucchini until just combined. Divide the batter evenly into the prepared skillet. Set aside.
4. In another bowl, combine the flour, oats, brown and white sugar, cinnamon, and pecans. Add the butter. Using your hand, pinch the ingredients together until the mixture looks crumbly.
5. Evenly divide 3/4 of the blueberries on top of the zucchini bread batter, pushing few slightly into the batter. Then, divide the crisp mixture evenly over the blueberries. Top with the remaining blueberries.
6. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Allow the pans to cool slightly.
7. Serve with vanilla ice cream if desired and enjoy!

Cook Time: 30-35 mins.

Makes: 2 skillets
