Waking up each morning, I am constantly aware that I am a new creation. I get out of bed and take a deep breath and kiss the morning hello. I am made fresh by the power of God. Each of us has this miracle happen to us every day, and we should not take it for granted.



"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." 2 Corinthians 5:17

When last I wrote you, I was in a holding pattern like a 747 running out of fuel, awaiting its turn to come in for a landing. I have landed. On March 25th, the day before my 46th birthday, I will have my bariatric weight-loss surgery. I will have an overnight stay in the hospital and be home in time for a liquid birthday dinner. Yay!

This birthday will be the beginning of a new year, another trip around the sun, and a unique opportunity to re-invent me physically, mentally, and most of all spiritually. I have to admit I have some concerns. They mainly stem around the idea of what I will look like after surgery and in the weeks months to come. I mean I know what I look like now and I have to say that I am a rather attractive man. Things can only go up from here. Right?

Body image is a massive thing for me. The last time I can remember being satisfied with how I looked was probably 3rd grade. That is when my troubles started. I learned to eat my emotions, keep the stuff inside, and process it alone. You can't do that; it only makes things worse. Letting go of your feelings at an appropriate time and space has enormous benefits. I believe every person needs someone to talk to about life. There is too much in this world we carry that we shouldn't. We need to let it go to God and another human being to keep our confidences and help us walk through this world unafraid.

Who do you call when life is out of control?

People used to call a pastor or priest for a long time, but due to the damage done in past years by ministers, it left a feeling of insecurity and mistrust in the clergy. I don't know how to change this image of the role of the pastor other than to say this: I will hold all conversations in confidentiality, and if I can't help, I will point you to someone who can.

All of us need a place to, as my wife says, "dump and run." We need to share our lives and know that we are in a safe place and that it will be OK. I am confident that you hold me in my prayers and offer your support as your pastor. Let me do the same for you.

I don't know what the next three-six months will look like or what I will look like, so I ask, please be kind. I am a work in process, a new creation; God is in control. Some months ago, I shared my main reason for having surgery with the Staff Parish Relations Committee. I want to share that rationale with you. "I am useless to this congregation if I am sick all the time because of my weight and health issues. I want to be healthy and live fully into the pastoral leader I can be, and that starts with taking care of myself. This surgery is the beginning of taking care of myself and ensuring for years to come I can be your pastor, full of life and grace to give."

Thank you for being a part of my team, and please keep me in your prayers on March 25th.

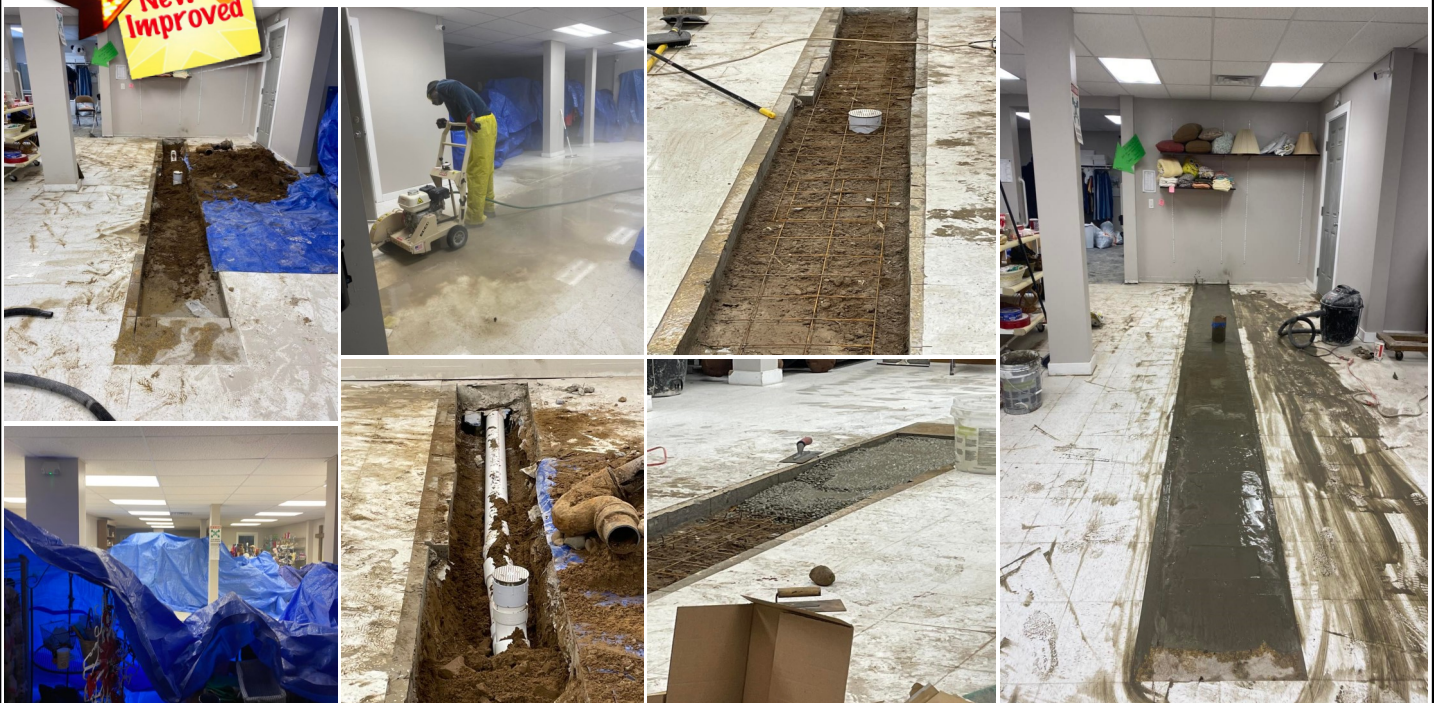

INGREDIENTS

- ♦ Eight 6-inch whole wheat tortillas
- ♦ Cooking spray or olive oil, for oiling tortillas
- ♦ 1 tablespoon spicy brown or Dijon mustard
- ♦ 1 cup shredded low-sodium Swiss (4 ounces)
- ♦ 4 ounces very thinly sliced low-sodium lean Black Forest or Virginia Ham
- ♦ 1/2 small red onion, extra thinly sliced
- ♦ Freshly ground black pepper
- ♦ 1 1/2 tablespoons no-sugar-added apple butter, plus more for topping, optional
- ♦ 2 small apples, cut into thin sticks (red and green)
- ♦ Lemon juice and ground cinnamon for tossing

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat the oven to 200 degrees F.
2. Spray 4 of the tortillas with cooking spray (or brush with olive oil). Lay the oiled tortillas on a large cutting board oiled-side down. Brush with the mustard and sprinkle with about half of the cheese. Top each evenly with a thin layer of ham, onions and some pepper, and then finish with the remaining cheese.
3. Brush the apple butter evenly on the remaining tortilla (filling sides in), and firmly press the tortillas together to make a quesadilla.
4. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Lay a quesadilla oiled-side down in the pan and cook until golden brown and the cheese starts to melt, about 2 minutes.
5. Spray the top of the quesadilla with cooking spray, turn and cook until the other side browns and the cheese is melted, 2 to 3 minutes more.
6. Transfer to a baking sheet and keep warm in the oven. Repeat with the remaining quesadillas.
7. Cut the quesadillas into 4 wedges and arrange on plates. Toss the apples with lemon and juice and cinnamon to taste. Serve with the apple slices.

Prep time: 10 mins.

Cook time: 20 mins.

Yield: 4 servings

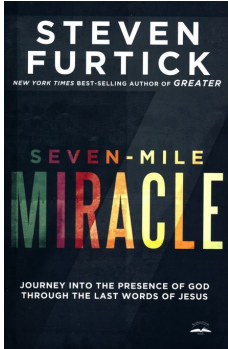
