A couple of weeks ago, I sent a letter to the Chancellor of the Board of Regents for New York State. I asked them to award me my high-school regent's diploma based on my work following high school. I thought I was righteous in making this request. Unfortunately, they responded with a form letter and a lot of legal mumbo jumbo that I have yet to decipher. As a result, I am not getting my NYS Regents diploma. I was looking for an affirmation that I was not a failure but had become a success, having earned my Bachelor of Arts Degree, Masters of Divinity, and now on my way to a Doctoral Degree.

Chemistry may have kept me from getting my Regents Diploma, but it shaped my path. Instead of staying in the state for college, I went to Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio had amazing experiences, and made lifelong friends. If I had not gone to Ashland University, I would not have become a Camp Counselor or a Youth Director in my early years of ministry. Likewise, I would not have the friends I have today. These friends have carried me through the darkest parts of my life. Decisions matter, but when we make decisions, we must know that God's providence goes before us and provides a way where there seems to be no way.

The photo above is from the Grand Canyon of Yellowstone National Park. As you can see, the water from the Yellowstone River flows over the yellow rock and leads into a lush valley. Sometimes I imagine making a "BIG" decision, is like going over the waterfall in a canoe. Thank God I don't own a canoe, but I do own a pick-up truck named 'Gracie Belle.'

Gracie Bell abruptly halted on I-90 about 20 miles from Portage, Wisconsin. The transmission gave out, and we were going nowhere. This section of I-90 was three lanes of traffic, and it was moving at 80mph. I was terrified and wondering if we would make it out of the traffic alive. We called the Wisconsin State Police, and the officer stayed with us for over 2.5 hours while we waited for AAA, which never came. Then, the officer called a local towing company out of Portage, WI, and they got us off the road. They put Gracie Belle on the flatbed truck and towed our camper to a KOA campground in Wisconsin Dells, WI, about 30 miles away. We were safe for the night and could regroup over a hot meal. However, we knew we had to get home; the only way to do that was to rent a U-Haul truck to tow the camper and a rental car for Mary and Kiah. Within 24 hours, we were back on the road home. We arrived at the Camp at Findley, Findley Lake, NY, at 5:30 pm on Friday. The next day we returned the U-Haul, drove the rental car to North Syracuse, NY, and rested from our trip.

The thing that did the truck in was that it did not have a transmission oil cooler. I had never heard of such a thing. I was unaware of the damage that could be done to a transmission by not having one while towing a camper. Gracie Belle is in Portage, WI, at one of the most extensive repair facilities in Northern Wisconsin. I have an estimate of the cost, and we are waiting to see what the extended warranty company will cover. Either way, this trip has not been a cheap date!

Had I known that the transmission would die, I wonder, "would I have taken the trip of a lifetime?" Probably not. I believe I would have been paralyzed by fear, not knowing where or when it would happen. Thank God this happened on our way home instead of our way out to West Yellowstone, MT. We had three beautiful weeks experiencing God's glory of creation. This was how the vacation was meant to be, beautiful, unexpected, and full of God's grace. I am not sweating the small stuff; I know God had a reason for allowing us to experience the terrifying event of crossing three lanes of traffic to get to the shoulder of the road. I also know that these unsettling experiences will be used by God to teach me how to respond in the future. God brought us an amazing tow driver and a repair center that was more than able to help us with Gracie Belle.

Here's what I know: my worth is not in a diploma, transmissions will fail, and life will go on while we are in the middle of a crisis. God's grace is more than enough to get us through. Don't make decisions on what you think you know, but on what you know; God is more than enough to meet your needs. Go in grace and celebrate your path; in God's timing, it will all work out.

FRESH PEACH CRUMB BARS

"Everybody loves these delicious, easy to make fresh Peach Crumb Bars with an almond flavored icing. They're terrific for any occasion like cook-outs, pot-lucks and summer extravaganzas."

INGREDIENTS

Crust & Crumble Topping:

- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 cup unsalted butter (cold, cut into cubes)
- 1 large egg (lightly beaten)

For the Peach Layer:

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1/4 teaspoon ground Cinnamon
- 5 large peaches, peeled and diced
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice

For the Icing (optional):

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 tablespoon milk (more or less for desired consistency)

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350 if using a glass pan, or 375 for a metal pan. Lightly grease or spray a 13x9-inch pan and set aside.

For the crust:

1. In a medium bowl whisk together 1 cup of sugar, 3 cups flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Using a pastry cutter, blend in the butter until the mixture resembles coarse sand. Add the lightly beaten egg and mix until the dough starts to hold together, but is still crumbly. Gently press a little more than half the dough into the prepared pan.

2. OPTIONAL: you can also process the sugar, flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon in the bowl of a food processor. Add the butter and process until the mixture resembles coarse sand. Add the egg and pulse until the dough starts to hold together.

For the peach mixture:

1. In a large mixing bowl whisk together the sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon. Add the diced peaches and toss to combine. Drizzle the lemon juice over the peaches and toss to coat. Pour the peach mixture over the crust and spread evenly.

2. Using your hands, press together handfuls of the remaining crumb topping to create clumps. Scatter the clumps and remaining crumbled topping over the fruit layer leaving some peaches showing through.

3. If using a glass pan, bake at 350 F degrees for 50-55 minutes or until lightly browned. If using a metal pan, bake at 375 F degrees for 40-45 minutes. Cool completely then chill before cutting and icing.

Tips for picking the best peaches for our Fresh Peach Crumb Bars:

- Select peaches that are firm with no shriveled skin;
- Peaches should be very fragrant, take a whiff;
- The fruit should be slightly soft when gently squeezed;
- Check for bruises and avoid damaged fruit;
- Color is a good indicator of great fruit, pick those with deep, rich hues
- Large peaches have the most sugar, select medium to large peaches;
- Buy local if you can, local peaches spend less time traveling and more time on the tree to ripen!

Prep: 20 mins. Cook: 45 mins. Total: 1 hr. 5 mins.

Yield: 20
