
SCRIPTURE OF THE MONTH - JANUARY - "No Worries in the New Year"

Chicken Parm Soup

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, diced
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning, plus more for topping
- 2 (14-oz.) can diced tomatoes
- 4 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 2 cups ditalini, mini penne, or other small pasta
- 3 cups chopped or shredded rotisserie chicken
- A pinch of Kosher salt and black pepper, for taste
- 3 oz. mozzarella cheese, shredded or thinly sliced
- Chopped fresh basil and red pepper flakes, for serving (optional)

DIRECTIONS

- **1.** Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, garlic, bay leaf, and Italian seasoning and cook, stirring, until the onion is softened, 4 to 5 minutes.
- **2.** Add the diced tomatoes, chicken broth, and 2 cups of water to the pot.
- 3. Increase the heat to high and bring to a boil.
- **4.** Add the pasta, return to a boil, and cook until the soup is slightly thickened and the pasta is al dente, 8 to 10 minutes.
- **5.** Remove from the heat and stir in the chicken. Discard the bay leaf. Season with salt and pepper.
- **6.** Divide the soup among bowls and top with the mozzarella. Let the cheese melt for 1 minute.
- **7.** Top with chopped basil, Italian seasoning, and red pepper flakes. Serve with any type of bread on the side to complete the dish! Enjoy!


