But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, ^{I4} I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 3:10-14

I have been on a journey of faith these past days. On June 8th I was hospitalized for a stroke. This was a life changing event. Suddenly I had to full rely on my relationship with God for everything. I had no control of my will except to reach out in anger, sadness, grief and loss. As my family gathered for my daughter's 17th birthday party, I was being stuffed in a MRI machine—being pumped full of medication and not knowing what was going to happen.



This event started as I ate breakfast and my friend could not understand my speech. He told me that If I didn't go to the ER he was going to kidnap me and take me there. I had already had two ER visits one in February and April; I did not want to go again. It turns out that I have been having mini strokes all along. I was in denial.

It's easy to live in denial until you realize that there are others in your life that count on you to be healthy and present. I deeply regret that I did not do something sooner than this event which would take me out of the pulpit for the month of June. I am not immune to emotions. I have shed many tears, embraced my loved ones, and I still find myself wondering if the God I preach about can help me, "come to believe that a power (God) greater than myself can restore me to sanity."

It is often said that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over expecting a different result. For a lot of my adult life, I have been practicing insanity with regards to my health. I can no longer live that way. My wife, daughter, and extended family are counting on me to be present and healthy. What I have learned from Rev. Melissa McCarthy of the Park United Methodist Church, Pulaski, NY, is that: "It's okay not to be okay."

Every day gets a little better. And every day I claim this scripture from Philippians 3:10 "I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead."

I want to go out of this world as an old man who has seen his grandchildren and lived a life worthy of my calling. I want to go out of this world kicking and screaming for Jesus, not in a hospital bed with tubes hooked up to me. I want to fully know Christ and that will take the rest of my lifetime.

I want to send love to Mike D. who insisted I go to the hospital and stay, Paul A. who visited me Sunday morning as I lay in bed not knowing what the future holds. I want to thank my mother for visiting with me as I got the news from the neurologist. Most importantly I want to send love to Mary and Kiah who have been an instrumental part of my recovery.

Thank you, for your love and care in this time. The cards, texts, phone calls and visits have been beautiful. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Jesus in this moment of crisis.

I pray God's blessing over you and your family this day. I look forward to seeing you in worship this Sunday as it will be my first Sunday back preaching. God bless you and yours.

The month of July also brings, 'Customer Appreciation' - we will be hosting FREE crafting events on Wednesdays 12-1.





Lemon-Blueberry Blondies



"With these delicious bars, you still get that signature chewy blondie texture, but can eat these for dessert, for breakfast, or as an anytime snack. These are rich, buttery, caramel-y, and fruit-filled, proving once and for all that blondies can be just as versatile and exciting as brownies!"

INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar
- 3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) unsalted butter, melted and slightly cooled
- 2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon finely grated lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 kosher salt
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup fresh blueberries, divided
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

- **1.** Preheat oven to 350F. Grease a 9" square baking pan with cooking spray. Line with parchment, leaving an overhang on 2 opposite sides. Grease parchment with cooking spray.
- **2.** In a medium bowl, whisk brown sugar, butter, vanilla, lemon zest, baking powder, and salt until well combined. Stir in eggs until well combined. Add flour and stir just until combined. Add 3/4 cup blueberries and fold just to distribute.
- **3.** Scrape batter into prepared pan; smooth top. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup blueberries.
- **4.** Bake blondies until golden and a tester inserted into the center comes out clean, about 35 minutes. Transfer pan to a wire rack and let cool completely.
- **5.** In a small bowl, whisk powdered sugar and lemon juice, adding water a few drops at a time, until a drizzling consistency is reached. Drizzle glaze over cooled blondies. Let set 15 minutes.
- **6.** Using parchment overhang, lift blondies out of pan and transfer to a cutting board. Slice and serve.

Prep Time: 10 mins. Total Time: 3 hrs.
