A Joyous Treasurer's Report for 2024

"Joyous" and "Treasurer's Report" are words seldom seen in the same sentence. But it is a summary of 2024 that I wanted to share with you. This is the first time since I have been Treasurer that we ended the year

with all the bills paid (except the full amount of Shared Ministries assessed by the conference) without borrowing from savings or investments. This can be attributed to:

- ⇒ Paying off the church mortgage at the beginning of 2023
- ⇒ Reducing staffing costs by rotating musicians instead of all three playing every week
- ⇒ Continued support by the congregation on a weekly basis as well as special offerings for heating system repairs and the Pastor's health insurance.
- ⇒ Additional rental income by opening our church to the GNAC theater group and Parents of Special Children as meeting places during the week.
- ⇒ Additional support from C&B 2.0 when requested.

Regular offerings during the year are just over \$170,000 for operating expenses. This included a \$3,000 rebate from National Grid plus \$7,000 from the congregation toward improving the heating system, which I am sure you have all noticed is consistently warm and comfortable on Sundays as it is throughout the week for our rental groups. At the end of the heating season, I hope to be able to show a reduction in the National Grid gas bill to show increased efficiency.

Aside from operating costs, we received and distributed over \$11,000 in monetary missions to local causes, international causes like Southern Sudan Health Project, as well as conference missions like UMCOR. In addition to monetary donations are the monthly contributions to organizations such as Erin's Angels, Diaper Bank, socks and mittens, and Thanksgiving bags. This only touches the surface of the benefits we can share with others when we all work together.

Our focus should always be on our mission to "seek, serve and share" with others, and this is made possible by having the support of a strong congregation base to build on!

Southern Sudan Health Project



Faith Journey became a supporter of Southern Sudan Health Project (SSHP) when Bradford Hunt was the shared pastor of Andrews Memorial in North Syracuse and Trinity here in Clay. It was an organization that Rev. Hunt helped to get started in response to the lack of health care in

South Sudan which came to his attention when Andrews supported one of the "Lost Boys" who arrived in Syracuse from South Sudan. Rather than building a clinic that people would have to travel too (a difficult task, if not impossible, in South Sudan). SSHP trained 8 home health care workers that would travel in pairs to local villages to treat people in their homes. SSHP supplied the workers with medicines, a small salary and bicycles to bring basic health care to the region.

Over the years the people of South Sudan have seen droughts, epidemics, floods, wars, evacuation to refugee camps and most recently incoming refugees from Sudan due to fighting in that country. Health care remains at the most basic level, treating diseases such as malaria, diarrhea (which can be fatal in children) and pneumonia. Seven of the eight health care workers trained at the beginning are still dedicated workers—the original eighth worker died and was replaced by his wife. The dedication of these health care workers was noted by a Spanish mission that built them a secure building to store their medicine supplies in. An agency of the United Nations organization brought electricity to that building. The workers still travel by bicycle to their villages and submit monthly reports of how many villagers they have treated.

There are multiple churches in our area that join together in supporting SSHP. In the past, we have provided the annual monetary support of one of the health care workers, Rebecca, in the amount of \$1,500. We have done bottle returns – "Cans for Sudan" – and some monetary donations but have fallen short of our goal.



items, socks, hats, mittens and over 55,000 diapers.

S'mores Campfire Cookies

"Is there anything more nostalgic than a s'more? They're a messy, sticky and delicious crowd pleaser! S'mores cookies combine classic chewy chocolate chip cookies with ooey-gooey campfire treat flavor, for the mot ridiculously fun cookie that can be made for any occasion!"

INGREDIENTS

- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup (8 full crackers) graham cracker crumbs
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 sticks, unsalted butter, at cool room temperature
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 2 large eggs, at cool room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup miniature chocolate chips
- 1 1/2 cups mini marshmallows
- 2-3 milk chocolate candy bars, broken into pieces

Prep Time: 15 mins.
Cook Time: 10 mins.
Total Time: 25 mins.
Yields: 40 medium-sized

cookies

DIRECTIONS

- **1.** Preheat oven to 375 degrees and line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- **2.** In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, graham cracker crumbs, baking soda, salt and cinnamon.
- **3.** In a large bowl, use an electric mixer fitted with the paddle attachment to beat the butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar on a medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 2 to 3 minutes.
- **4.** Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add the vanilla, then slowly beat in the flour mixture. Stir in the chocolate chips with a rubber spatula.
- **5.** Use a medium spring-loaded cookie scoop to drop 1 1/2-tablespoon sized balls onto the prepared baking sheets, spacing about 1 1/2 inches apart.
- **6.** Bake for 6 to 7 minutes, or until they have spread and are just beginning to set at the edges. Remove from the oven.
- **7.** Push 2 to 3 marshmallows and pieces of chocolate bar into each cookie. Return to the oven and bake an additional 3 to 4 minutes or until golden brown at the edges. Cool for about 5 minutes before removing to wire racks to cool completely. Cookies can be stored in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 3 days.

Tessa's Tips & Tricks:

- * Baking Sheets: a light colored aluminum half-sheet pan is my favorite for baking cookies. Avoid dark, non-stick pans as they brown too much and may burn the bottom of your cookies before they have a chance to spread and bake evenly.
- * Avoid Dry Cookies: Be sure to measure your flour correctly by weighting with a digital scale or by using the spoon and level method. If you don't measure correctly, you could end up with dry and crumbly dough and hard cookies that don't spread and lack flavor. Don't reduce the sugar—it does so much more in baking than beyond sweetening.
- * Mixers: If you don't have a electric mixer, a hand mixer will work just fine for these s'mores cookies
- * Chocolate: I prefer to use semisweet miniature chocolate chips inside the cookie dough so the toppings really take the center stage, this also helps to balance the sweetness of the milk chocolate chunks.
- * **Double Batch:** Simply double all the ingredients to double this smores cookie recipe, you'll yield about 80 medium-sized cookies.
