10 The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, 2 "Make two silver trumpets. Of hammered work, you shall make them, and you shall use them for summoning the congregation and for breaking camp. 3 And when both are blown, all the congregation shall gather to you at the entrance of the tent of meeting. 4 But if they blow only one, then the chiefs, the heads of the tribes of Israel, shall gather themselves to you.

I awoke the one night to an Amber Alert on my cell phone. It was not only on my phone, but Mary's and Kiah's too. Then Kovu, our dog, who was sound asleep, woke up and howled. You can imagine the chaos that stirred in the house that night. Alarms aren't always a bad thing. Smoke detectors save lives, and sirens of ambulances, police cars, and fire trucks signal us to pull to the side of the road so that they can get through. In hospitals, when someone is in distress and a CODE alarm goes off, the nurses and doctors come running with a crash cart and all the necessary supplies to save the individual's life.

The work of God in scripture is all about God sounding the alarm to the people of Israel that they are going in the wrong direction. Yet this passage in Numbers describes how the Israelites should break camp or approach the tent of meeting.

This morning, Kiah texted me from school that they were to shelter in place. I soon got a text from the school that all was clear, and the students were safe. From time to time, we all need instruction on how to break camp and move forward in this life. Sometimes, we need instructions on approaching the tent of meeting, where God resides.

In one of the churches I served, there was a man who would stand outside the church every Sunday, and that was as far as he would go. I asked him one Sunday, "Why don't you come in and sit with your friends and family?" His reply, "If you knew what a sinner I am, you would understand that the church would fall in. on itself." I felt bad for the man and did not know what to say. One Sunday, he sat in the back pew crying throughout the service. He was still there as the service closed, and I had finished receiving individuals. Still crying.

I sat next to him and said nothing. After about fifteen minutes, he began to speak and share his heart and his guilt and shame. I took his hand and prayed for God's grace over his life and forgiveness. He had come into the sanctuary that day because his grandson was playing the trumpet as part of the worship service, and it broke down walls of suffering that he had been carrying for a lifetime.

Nothing excludes us from God. God doesn't ask for perfect people but imperfect people who can hear the alarm and rise to the occasion. The cell phones were going off in the middle of the night to alert us to a missing child. We could do nothing about that Amber alert but stop and pray; maybe that's what we were called to do in that moment?

Many people think that they must be perfect to come to church and enter the sanctuary. That is not true. God never asks you to be a perfect person, but a person who is willing to stop for a moment and listen to the words of grace spoken by Jesus, "Peace be with you."

The next time you encounter a police officer, firefighter, emergency medical technician, nurse, doctor or pastor thank them for answering the call.

The alarms are sounding will you answer the call?

Native American Ministries Sunday—May 4, 2025

United Methodists are called to recognize and honor the gifts and contributions made by Native Americans to our society and church. The United Methodist Church acknowledges a gap in understanding Native American life and culture, while affirming the sacredness of Indigenous peoples, their languages, their unique identities and their contributions to the church and the world.

Last year, almost \$240,000 was raised to support these vital ministries through the Native American Ministries offering:

- Fifty percent of the funds collected stay within the annual conference to support Native American ministries.
- Twenty-five percent of donations fund scholarships for Native Americans pursuing ordained or licensed ministry at any approved theological school.
- Twenty-five percent of donations collected are allocated to develop impactful programs. These funds enable the UMC to collaborate with established Native ministries to create new initiatives for Native American communities. One of the beautiful things about The United Methodist Church is that, together, we can accomplish far more than we could on our own. Together, we celebrate the voice and ministry of Native Americans worldwide.

United Methodist Student Day—May 25, 2025

Traditionally observed on the last Sunday of November, this Special Sunday was moved to May by the 2024 General Conference. Strawberry Cinnamon Muffins

"This super easy Strawberry Muffin recipe only takes a few minutes for delicious fluffy muffins filled with fresh strawberries along with cinnamon and vanilla to start your day."

INGREDIENTS

Wet Ingredients:

- 1 cup strawberries
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 egg
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Dry Ingredients:

- 1 3/4 cup flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon baking powder, preferably aluminumfree
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Topping:

- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Prep Time: 15 mins. Cook Time: 20 mins. Total Time: 35 mins. Servings: 12 standard-

sized muffins

Calories: 156kcal/1 muffin

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 375. Prep muffin pan with paper muffin liners for 12 muffins. Clean and chop strawberries to about 1/2 inch
- **2.** In a small bowl, whisk together wet ingredients: vegetable oil, milk, egg, and vanilla.
- **3.** Combine dry in a large bowl: flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and cinnamon. Then add the chopped strawberries and coat.
- 4. Mix topping of sugar and cinnamon.
- **5.** Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and mix until combined. Mix by hand until there is no dry left but do not overmix.
- **6.** Add the batter to a muffin tin, divided into 12 standard-size muffin cups. Fill about 2/3 full, then sprinkle 1/4 teaspoon of the sugar and cinnamon mixture to the top of each muffin.
- **7.** Bake until a toothpick comes out clean—about 20 minutes. Move to a cooling rack and cool for 10 minutes before serving.

Tips, Tricks & Questions:

About the Strawberries:

Test one of your berries, if they are not sweet—bump the sugar up a bit. If the berry is very moist, dice a bit smaller and if dry, then they can be diced a bit bigger. It's important to use 1/2 inch as the average; if berries are too big, the moisture in the berries will create pockets from the steam.

How to keep Muffins Fluffy:

Have your eggs, butter and milk at room temperature, they will come together smoother and trap air better. Don't overmix the batter—it's OK to have slightly lumpy mix. Use fresh baking powder since it can be outdated, baking soda does not expire. Be sure the oven is preheated accurately before baking muffins.

Storing Muffins:

If you have leftover muffins, store them in an airtight container at room temperature for up to three days after baking for best taste, texture, and freshness. They can also be stored in the refrigerator for a week or in the freezer for up to two months—thaw overnight in the fridge.

Can I use other Berries with this recipe?

Yes, raspberries, blackberries and blueberries will work best with this exact recipe, simply substitute the berry!


